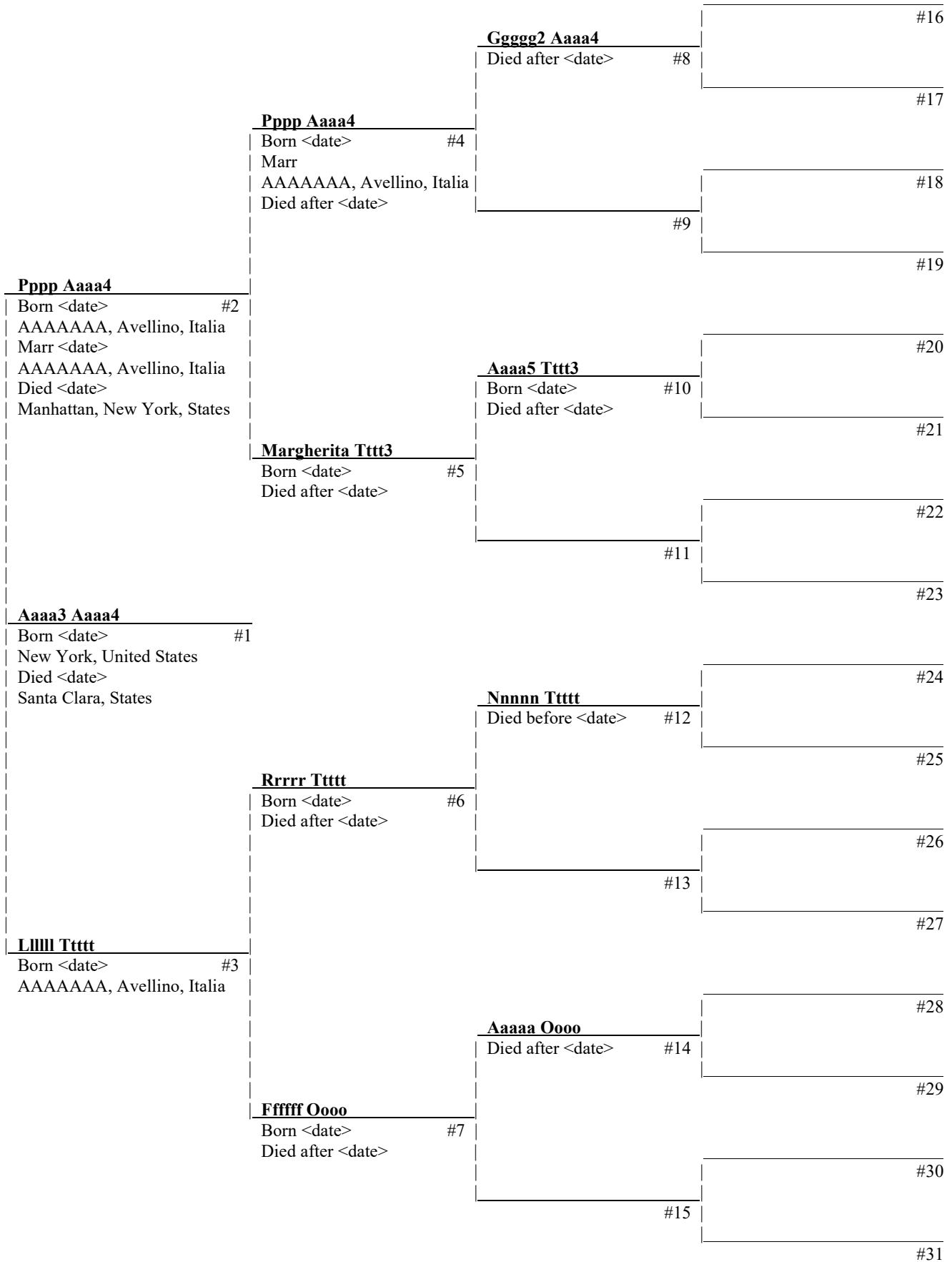

Llllll was [born](#) on 11.00 AM <date>in AAAAAAA, his father Rrrrr (carder, 30 years old, son of dead Nnnnn) showed up at 6PM to declare his birth to major Ggggg Ggggg2 Sssss2.

Pppp's parents were Pppp and Mmmm Tttt2, Llllll's parents were Rrrrr and Fffff Oooo

Pppp (blacksmith) and Llllll (housewife) [married](#) in AAAAAAA on <date>, officer was Eeeee Rrrrr4, witnesses were Aaaa3 Bbbbbb and Vvvvv Jjjjjj.

While Pppp resided in AAAAAAA, Fffff is said to reside in New York.

Pppp and Llllll had two sons in AAAAAAA: Rrrrr2 was [born](#) on 00:05 AM <date>, Rrrrr was [born](#) on 11.00 AM <date>

Migration Story:

Pppp, a blacksmith, arrived in New York City on <date>. Aaaa, who was born as Llllll but used the name Aaaa in the U.S., was a seamstress. She landed in New York on <date>, accompanied by their children, Rrrrr2 (born in AAAAAAA on <date>) and Rrrrr (born in AAAAAAA on <date>). There is no record of Llllll's previous arrival in New York, despite the residence she declared at her marriage.

The family's growth is documented through the Census records of 1905, 1910, 1920, 1930, and 1940.

In [1910](#) (195 Mott Street, Manhattan, New York, New York) Family is composed by Pppp, Aaaa, Rrrrr2, Rrrrr, Pppp and Aaaa (almost two years old). Sssss probably died.

Pppp died on <date> in Manhattan

In [1920](#) (245 Mulberry Street, Manhattan, New York City, New York) Family is composed by Aaaa, Rrrrr2, Rrrrr, Pppp, Aaaa, Aaaa3 (7 years old) and Aaaa2 (5 years old).

In [1930](#) (5920 60th Street, Kings, Brooklyn, New York City, New York) Family is composed by Aaaa, Rrrrr2, Pppp, Aaaa, Aaaa3 and Aaaa2. No further news on Rrrrr.

In [1940](#) (1034 18th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York City, New York) Family is composed by Aaaa, Rrrrr2, Aaaa and Aaaa2. No further news on Pppp. Aaaa3 married Sssss Aaaa3 Kkkkk.

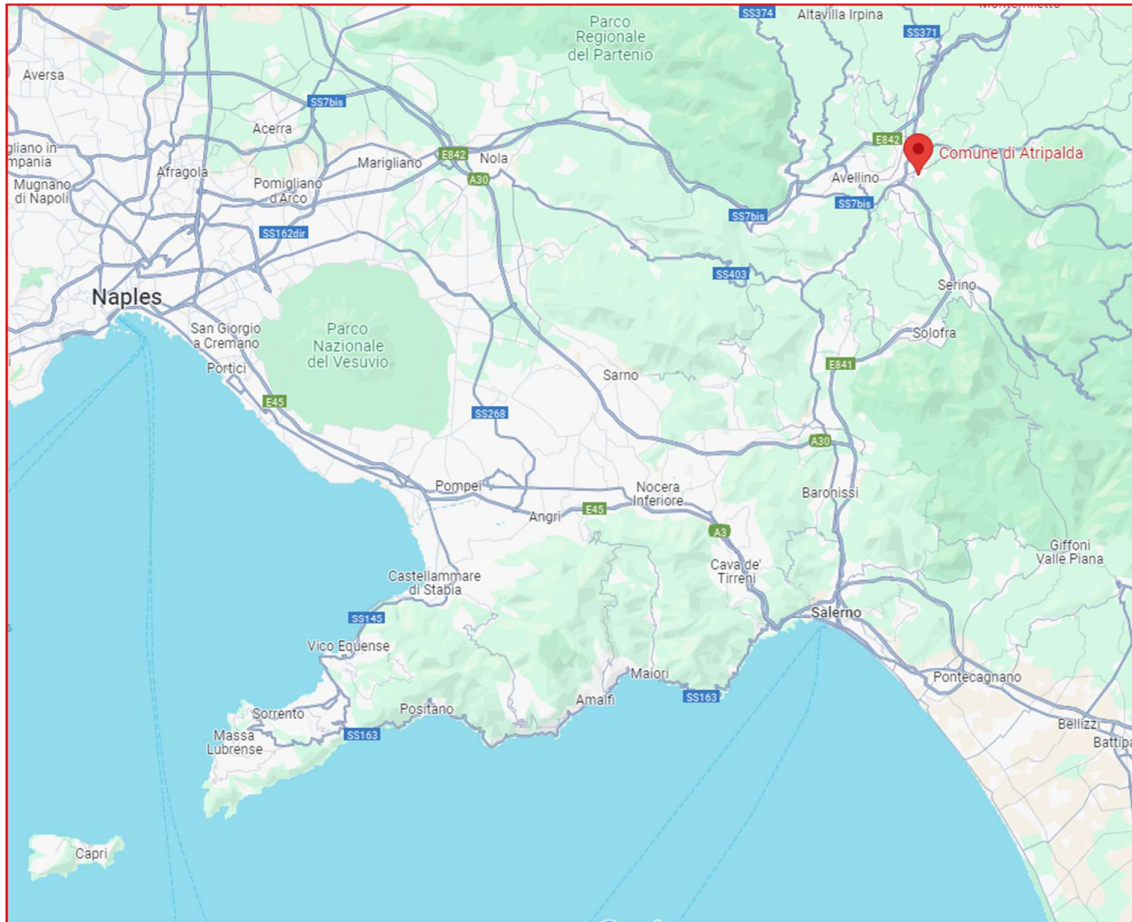
